GNLU: Trilateral Training Programme on "Investigation and Trials in Justice Delivery System"

Gandhinagar, April 23, 2018: The Gujarat National Law University (GNLU) in collaboration with Raksha Shakti University (RSU) and Gujarat Forensic Science University (GFSU) organized a three-day Trilateral Training Programme titled "Investigation and Trials in Justice Delivery System".
