The GNLU Center for Public International (CPIL) organised a Special Guest-lecture on International Law in relation to India-China and India-Pakistan. Professor Emeritus Dr Veer Singh Vice-chancellor of NALSAR, Hyderabad, narrated the forgotten historical facts about China and Pakistan and its significant relationship with India, with special emphasis on Pre-Independent and Post-Independent India. He clarified how India as a country of power and strength in terms of political ideologies, economic capacity, cultural and social values could possibly lead the whole of Asia in international community and legal system strengthening the international rule of law. His illuminating lecture inspired law students to study International Law in inter-disciplinary approach and perspective in order to critically analyse the march of human society that is present with rich tapestry of social, cultural, racial, economic, political and civilizational values. He engaged students with gripping attention on how history, culture and capacities of human qualities can bring integral understanding of what constitutes international law in global village.
