

# **Legal Methods**

#### **Objective**

This course is designed to impart upon the students a set of skills essential to the profession of Law. Main objectives are:

- To be aquatinted with the fundamental understanding of the concept of law.
- To be conversant with various legal systems of the world.
- To be able to understand the classification of law and administration of justice in India.
- To develop familiarity with various methods of legal reasoning and research.
- To learn to analyze statutes, cases and other sources of law.
- To be able to discern relevant facts and apply legal principle to facts.
- To acquire ability to write more clearly, succinctly and improve oral communications.
- To learn to prepare a variety of legal documents and to cite legal authorities correctly in those documents.
- To understand and appreciate the process of legal research, including various types of legal research materials including the methods of accessing them, both in print and electronic.

#### **Course Content**

Legal Methods is a course for beginners in Law. It is a course in method or process of locating and identifying legal principles from legal literatures and materials. The set of skills expected to be inculcated among students are research, writing, knowledge of meaning, purpose and function of Law, legal system, administration of justice etc. It is not the intent to make the student expert in any of these areas but rather to provide a minimum level of familiarity with these areas and skills.
