

GNLU embraces remote working to combat the spread of coronavirus

Gandhinagar, March 20, 2020: To aid the Government of Gujarat’s efforts to combat the spread of coronavirus in the state, Gujarat National Law University (GNLU) has decided to adopt the work-from-home policy for its employees, with effect from today.
