GNLU Center for Environmental Law concluded one day workshop on "Role of Legal

Stakeholders in Strengthening and Implementation of the Biological Diversity Act with Special

Focus on ABS Provisions"

The Center for Environmental Law of Gujarat National Law University, along with the United Nations Environmental Program, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Gujarat Biodiversity Board, National Biodiversity Authority and Global Environmental Facility organized a capacity-building workshop on 'Role of Legal Stakeholders in Strengthening and Implementation of the Biological Diversity Act with Special Focus on ABS Provisions' on 27th September 2014 at the University's campus.

The occasion was graced and inaugurated by Dr. J.A. Khan, PCCF and Chairman, Gujarat Biodiversity Board.
