TRIPARTITE WINTER LAW SCHOOL: NATIONAL SECURITY AND DEFENSE LAWS AND PRACTICES 2018



Brief Description

Gujarat National Law University (Centre for Public International Law and Centre for Foreign Policy and Security Studies), University Paris Nanterre, Paris and University of Potsdam, Germany, jointly organized, Trilateral Winter Law School on National Security and Defense Laws and Practices, from 13 to 16 February 2018.





The main theme of Winter Law School, a trilateral academic- scholarly academy, was the legal and regulatory challenges of national security and defense, which is often tackled through political and geopolitical lenses. National security and defense law and practices is a comparative approach often addressed through the political and geopolitical lenses. The aim of the research project launched with trilateral winter University was to tackle the regulatory challenges of national security and defense.



Indeed, globalization transformed the constraint network in which traditional national security and defense regulation were framed. Through academic and professional exchange between the three national traditions namely India, France and Germany these regulatory challenges were addressed and discussed.



The four day program had covered a wide range of topics concerning National security, Defense laws and practices such as Link between political power and Military power, Defense in time of emergency, securing the means to ensure an efficient defense, new security and defense issues etc. The participants representing the three nations had presented their perspectives on the topics. The winter school had witnessed 36 contributors from India, France and Germany.
