ABOUT CENTRE FOR WOMEN AND CHILD RIGHTS

The GNLU Centre for Women and Child Rights (GCWCR) is committed to fostering social justice, human rights, and the empowerment of marginalized women and children across India. The GNLU Centre for Women and Child Rights is Centre for Excellence established under the aegis of Gujarat National Law University. The Centre has partnered with Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt of India; National Commission for Protection of Child Rights, New Delhi; Gender Resource Centre, Govt of Gujarat among others to provide extensive research and policy inputs. The Centre also produces student-led research in the areas of Section of 12(1)(c) of Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009, School Mergers and Surrogacy Laws. As a part of the student-led advocacy for awareness regarding cervical cancer, the Centre submitted a representation to the Minister of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, on September 1, 2023 urging the Ministry to include HPV vaccines in the Universal Immunization Programme. The Ministry acknowledged and Considered these concerns, in a letter dated October 20, 2023.
