

# ACADEMIC DIVISION

#### ACADEMIC CURRICULUM COMMITTEE

The main object of the GNLU Academic Curriculum Committee (ACC) is to provide guidance, approval and supervision to the faculty members on curricular innovation and instructional quality by ensuring that the curriculum of the University is academically sound, comprehensive and responsive to the evolving needs of the society; thus, serving the University's mission, and also the educational and vocational needs of the students. This Committee comprises mostly the senior faculty members of the University..

#### ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITY:

- ACC is entrusted with developing the standard curriculum and addressing the broader concerns that would be reflected in the curriculum framework. The following are the broad roles of the ACC:
  - Defining the goals and objectives of the curriculum;
  - · Designing and management of the curriculum;
  - · Scheduling of courses;
  - Recommendations on new courses and new instructional programmes;
  - Recommendations on deletion of courses and instructional programmes;
  - Vetting of proposed courses;
  - Allocation of subjects;
  - Offering academic inputs to initiatives and proposals for different types of extra-UG courses;



 Review, evaluation, revision and implementation of policies/guidelines for courseoutline/reference materials, etc to ensure that the curriculum is coherent, coordinated, fully integrated, current and effective.

### CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

Curriculum development is attached to the highest degree of importance at GNLU. The University follows a healthy and systematic process for the designing and development of curriculum. Faculty-members are allocated subjects (core, optional and seminar) based on the preferences indicated and the expertise shown through applications that come, along with the notice of intimation of the same, at the end of the semester to decide curriculum plan for the next semester). ACC prepares a draft-list of allocation of subjects among the faculty-members. Upon the acceptance and approval (of the draft) by the Director and the Dean (AA), the ACC releases the final list of allotment. GNLU designs its curricula in accordance with the UGC and the BCI mandates and does take into account the syllabi of other prominent National Law Universities in India and major foreign universities for further up-gradation of its own curricula.

At GNLU, the curriculum is reviewed and upgraded every year. So, meaningful restructuring, keeping account of latest developments and anticipated developments is done every year. Each faculty member is required to anticipate research developments in his/her particular subject. The University follows a systematic process for the designing, development, updating and revision of the curriculum.

COMMITTEE

The philosophy of Gender Sensitization at GNLU involves creation of value and virtue-based systems for gender equality. It involves creation of a gender sensitive social and cultural environment which discourages gender biased behaviors and practices.

## INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE

The University aims to provide a safe working and learning campus life for staff and students, free from gender discrimination and sexual harassment. As per the guidelines given by the UGC's Saksham Report with respect to the constitution of Complaints Committee on "Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace", GNLU has constituted the Internal Complaint Committee (ICC). The ICC shall be responsible for the formal redressal of complaints of gender discrimination and sexual harassment. It shall receive the complaints, conduct inquiries and recommend disciplinary action, if any, in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations. GNLU is committed in terms of providing a working environment as creative, productive and fulfilling. This includes ensuring that each student, teacher and non-teaching staff work together, in an environment of mutual trust, freedom of expression and dignity, free from all forms of violence, harassment, exploitation, discrimination and intimidation. Accordingly, ICC has framed the rules and regulations namely, 'Sexual Harassment of Women at the GNLU, Redressal of Complaints Regulations 2014', after due deliberations and same has been notified by the University. These regulations prescribe the institutional process to handle complaints of reported Sexual Harassment issues. Gender Sensitisation Committee is also responsible to create awareness on gender related issues and promote gender sensitisation.



## **GNLU COMPETITIVE EXAM GUIDANCE**

## COMMITTEE (GCGC)

The Gujarat National Law University has taken up the responsibility of grooming and spearheading awareness for Civil Services, Judicial Services and other competitive exams under the aegis of the GNLU Competitive Exam Guidance Committee (GCGC). The GCGC has been functioning since 2010. The primary objective of the committee is to groom students in their preparations for the UPSC and the Judiciary examinations. The Committee is coordinating with several professional institutes that have experience in training and grooming aspirants into officers.

## CRITIQUE – A STUDENT DISCUSSION FORUM

Critique is a student discussion forum that eliminates hierarchy and initiates such conversations about the most pressing issues that our society faces with the humble aim that discussants may leave the platform with an understanding about a new perspective. The kind of perspective, specifically, that can neither be gained from books nor from lectures. Where the forum does not press strongly regarding the achievement of goals, it places much greater emphasis on method. The forum ensures that it remains open to all views expressed by students and this openness is designed to strike at the root of various prejudices, misconceptions and stereotypes that often remain embedded in our minds.





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### **DEBATING SOCIETY**

The GNLU Debating Society was formed with the aim to promote parliamentary debating within University and to increase participation in national and international debating competitions. The Society considered it necessary to inculcate debating as an everyday activity among GNLU students and, hence, introduced the concept of the GNLU Debating League (GDL) which meant holding weekly debating sessions and maintaining a tab of participation. The Society's aim was to make debating a culture within GNLU, and to develop that idea, it was necessary to have an international debating competition within the University.

### **GNLU MEDIA**

GNLU Media is constituted to cover all the activities of the University in coordination with other Committees. The GNLU Media Committee provides a common platform for all events whether Cultural, Academic, Sports or Entertainment. For the purpose of swift and efficient management, the Committee is composed into two sub committees, namely the Multimedia Wing and the Social Media & Content Creation Wing. We strive towards exploring and portraying opinions, views and coverage of social and legal issues, alumni interactions and faculty interviews. The Team has an inside track, which provides substantive content, thoughtful commentary, and informed discussion with an occasional bit of wit and irreverence.



# GNLU LEGAL INCUBATION COUNCIL

GNLU Legal Incubation Council (GLIC) is established as part of GNLU's vision towards excellence in imparting quality legal education and executing the same in the form of support system for entrepreneurs in the domain of law and interdisciplinary domains through institutional mechanism. GLIC intends to act as a tool to promote innovation, entrepreneurship and self-employment amongst law students as an attractive and viable career option.

The Council established in the year 2016 to convert students' enterprising ideas to be converted into full fledge startups through institutional support mechanism by providing faculty and industry mentoring, funding and networking opportunities. In 2018, the incubation centre of GNLU registered itself as a GNLU Legal Incubation Council Section 8 company to provide its services in more formal and professional manner.

In the year 2017, under the State Government's scheme of Student Startup and Innovation Policy, the GNLU received the grant of Rs. 20 lakh to promote innovation and entrepreneurship. This grant helped the incubation council to promote entrepreneurship activities on fast-track mode by organizing various activities like Annual Business plan competition, expert lectures, workshops, seminars including providing seed funding to student run startups. Since inception, the incubation center has supported total 19 student run start-ups.

### OBJECTIVES

- The main objective of establishing the GNLU Legal Incubation Council (GLIC) is to act as an
  institutional mechanism for providing various startups related services in all aspects of
  building enterprise to develop the startup ecosystem in the country.
- To promote the spirit of entrepreneurship by encouragement towards Innovation and nurturing Innovative ideas among the student community.
- To promote knowledge-driven and technology-based ventures among the students, faculty, and alumni, equip them with necessary entrepreneurial skills, and provide all the required assistance.



- GLIC provides nurturing and empathetic entrepreneurial ecosystem through mentoring, networking support, ecosystem building, entrepreneurship training and capacity building, supporting innovations through seed fund and developing and entrepreneurial.
- · Currently 15 Student Startups are incubated at GLIC which involves.
  - · Workshops and Seminars on entrepreneurships and IPR.
  - · Business Plan competitions.
  - Short term Certificate course on Legal Aspects of Startups.
  - Dedicated programs for student startup enabling to build upon their idea from scratch and convert it into a potential real venture and Prototype Stage Startups, to take their validated ideas to early revenue real ventures.

### LEGAL HISTORY MUSEUM

With an aim to bridge the gap between law and society, GNLU established a Legal History Museum in 2014. The Museum is committed to preserve the Legal Heritage of the world and bring awareness about it in the society. The museum also aims to inspire the younger generation of the country to contribute in the development of the legal sector of India. The museum so far has 394 objects in its collection. It has so far developed 5 galleries; the main collection of the museum includes the copy of Sardar Patel's 1912 Law Degree, replica of Magna Carta 1215, Cyrus Cylinder 6th Century BC and copy of the Indian Constitution in Hindi and English. The museum also includes the exhibit of the Diorama of the Great Trial of Mahatma Gandhi 1922 made of Fiber plastic. This is the new exhibit of the museum. It induces the life size sculptures Mahatma Gandhi as well as of the people that witnessed the Great Trial of Mahatma Gandhi in 1922.

- · The Glorious Gujarat and Legacy of Law Gallery.

## INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY

The University has a state-of-the-art ICT infrastructure on the campus. Computer Systems of all offices and workplace of the University are connected through LAN with high-end Servers. The Computer Networks of various buildings are interconnected through fibre optic cables. The University has 1 Gbps connectivity on optical fibre under NMEICT/NKN project from BSNL and from RailTel for the Internet access. The WiFi Network connectivity is available at the Hostels, Admin/Library block, Mess, Faculty cabins, Guest house and some outdoor locations of the campus. More than 290 computer systems including laptops with latest configuration and updated genuine software are installed at various sections and divisions of the University.

The ICT Section manages Campus Local Area Network of GNLU and provides technical support for Computer Hardware, Software and Network Infrastructure to the users. The Section is responsible for the availability of intra-campus connectivity of all the departments, hostels, staff quarters, guesthouse and the internet connectivity in the GNLU Campus.

### LEGAL SERVICES COMMITTEE

The Legal Services Committee set up under Section 4(k) of the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987, rides on the principles of empowering the society with legal awareness and legal aid. Over the years, the LSC has strived to recognize the potential of law as an instrument of social change. The Legal Services Committee acts as a 'community legal clinic' and focuses on, inter alia, the deprivation of government benefits, eviction and issues of domestic violence. The LSC has always been motivated to work for the betterment of the society and more so for the enhancement of living standards of the underprivileged. In this regard, activities such street plays, drama performances and community legal service programs which promote legal awareness in areas akin to environment, consumer rights, human rights, right to information and labour laws are often organized by the LSC.

### GNLU PRO BONO MANDATE

With a view to encourage students to give back to the society and to promote access to justice, GNLU from the academic year 2015-16, made it mandatory for each student to undertake Pro Bono activities for a minimum of 100 hours in his/her entire tenure of undergraduate law programme. Activities by GNLU students to complete their mandate includes undertaking legal literacy programmes, conducting social awareness programmes, promoting government schemes, providing legal advice, assisting Legal Services Authority, undertaking cleanliness drives among others. This Pro Bono mandate of the students is overseen by the Pro Bono wing, which is a part of the Legal Services Committee. As per the Pro Bono guidelines, a student can undertake Pro Bono work only under a gazetted officer. The students are required to complete at least 20 hours of Pro Bono work each academic year, thereby culminating into 100 hours of Pro Bono work in five years of their undergraduate law programme. On completion of their Pro Bono work, students are required to submit a certificate signed and stamped by the gazetted officer under whom the Pro Bono work was undertaken and a report explaining the nature of work and the impact of such work in the community.

These certificates and work completion reports are then scrutinized by the faculty convenor of the Legal Services Committee. Non-completion of the Pro Bono mandate leads to punitive measures such as withholding examination results and removal from membership of all centres, committees and clubs run by GNLU. The Pro Bono wing also undertakes certain activities throughout the academic year where students are awarded Pro Bono hours for volunteering. Some of the activities undertaken by the Pro Bono wing include undertaking door-to-door awareness campaigns on domestic violence act, procedure to file FIRs; street plays; Swacch Bharat campaign; organising blood donation drive among others. In order to motivate students to contribute to the society, GNLU has also introduced the Annual Pro Bono Legal Aid Award. One student from each batch is felicitated with this award for the Pro Bono work undertaken by her in an academic year. A special panel is set up each year to evaluate the work undertaken by the nominees and the panel looks into indicators such as nature of the activity, sociolegal impact of the activity among others.







### LIBRARY AND LEARNING RESOURCES

The library is the central focus of all university academic, research, extension, and training activities. The main functions of our library are the acquisition, dissemination, and preservation of information resources. Library offers a cozy, supportive, and welcoming environment for reading, research, reference, and intellectual exchanges. It provides a vast space to accommodate

more than 300 users simultaneously, with common, group, and individual silent reading space facilities. The library occupies 2760 square meters of space and is the largest airconditioned wing in the administrative building to stack and preserve print and digital resources.

Higher education institutions across the nation switched to online instruction in March-April 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic's early outbreak. Although the students could not physically use the extensive library facilities, the GNLU Library still made various strategic adjustments to continue providing its services to the teachers and students, primarily in digital form. It accelerated and reinforced trends in library spending on digital materials and services.

The GNLU Library made significant investments in acquiring (buying and licensing) digital collections even before the pandemic. To facilitate distance research, teaching, and learning, our library was well-equipped to switch to virtual services. We could close and reopen the physical library and allocate changes to collections, operations, and library services.

### LIBRARY ACQUISITION

The library has a vast collection of 43117 books, e-books, back volumes, theses, and dissertations. The library also subscribes to print journals, e-journals, and online databases. We currently have 1067 e-books (with remote access) from renowned publishers like Oxford University Press, Cambridge University Press, Routledge, Taylor &; Francis, Bloomsbury, Kluwer International, Brill Nijhoff, Edward Elgar, Thomson Reuters, and Informa law for law and related subjects, advancing our vision of creating an excellent collection in digital form.

To cater to the needs of our patrons, we provide access to E-books from various databases, i.e., Ebc Reader, Kluwer Arbitration, Kluwer IP Law, LexisKnowledge, OLRL (Oxford Legal Research Library), OSAIL (Oxford Scholarly authorities on International Law). The library acquired more than 974 Books, which include books on International laws, Financial and Investment laws, Intellectual Property Rights, Biotechnology law, air & Space law, Management, other special collections on Law and Economics, Entrepreneurship, Start-up, Literature, Political science, History, Management, and Commerce, etc. The best collections in law and interdisciplinary subjects are a top priority for our library collections and development.

The library has acquired special collections on International law, Air & Space Law, Sports Law, Biotechnology Law, and Maritime Law. We have an Institutional repository of GNLU on DSpace.


