

ACADEMIC DIVISION

ACADEMIC CURRICULUM COMMITTEE

The main object of the GNLU Academic Curriculum Committee ('ACC') is to provide guidance, approval and supervision to the faculty members on curricular innovation and instructional quality by ensuring that the curriculum of the University is academically sound, comprehensive and responsive to the evolving needs of the society; thus, serving the University's mission, and also the educational and vocational needs of the students. This Committee comprises mostly the senior faculty members of the University.

ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITY:

- ACC is entrusted with developing the standard curriculum and addressing the broader concerns that would be reflected in the curriculum framework.
 The following are the broad roles of the ACC:
- Defining the goals and objectives of the curriculum;
- Designing and management of the curriculum;
- · Scheduling of courses;
- Recommendations on new courses and new instructional programmes;
- Recommendations on deletion of courses and instructional programmes;
- Vetting of proposed courses;
- Allocation of subjects;
- Offering academic inputs to initiatives and proposals for different types of extra-UG courses;
- Review, evaluation, revision and implementation of policies/guidelines for course-outline/reference materials, etc to ensure that the curriculum is coherent, coordinated, fully integrated, current and effective.

CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

Curriculum development is attached to the highest degree of importance at GNLU. The University follows a healthy and systematic process for the designing and development of curriculum. Faculty-members are allocated subjects (core, optional and seminar) based on the preferences indicated and the expertise shown through applications (that come, along with the notice of intimation of the same, at the end of the semester to decide curriculum plan for the next semester). ACC prepares a draft-list of allocation of subjects among the faculty-members. Upon the acceptance and approval (of the draft) by the Director and the Dean (AA), the ACC releases the final list of allotment.

GNLU designs its curricula in accordance with the UGC and the BCI mandates, and does take into account the syllabi of other prominent National Law Universities in India and major foreign universities for further up-gradation of its own curricula. At GNLU, the curriculum is reviewed and upgraded every year. So, meaningful restructuring, keeping account of latest developments and anticipated developments is done every year. Each faculty member is required to anticipate research developments in his/her particular subject. The University follows a systematic process for the designing, development, updating and revision of the curriculum.



TYPES OF SESSIONS CONDUCTED

ON DEMAND PREPARATORY SESSIONS

These sessions are conducted as and when the demand for them is made by the concerned beneficiary batch, such as prior to examinations or internal evaluations. These sessions were conducted for the subjects like Law of Contracts, Introduction to Sociology, Legal History, etc. simultaneously with the weekly / regular academic sessions.

THE FIRST YEAR INFORMATION PROGRAMME

The First Year Information Programme is a session aimed at introducing the first year students to the university environment and acquaint them with the vital information regarding academics, university examinations, preparation for examinations, internships, publications, social and non-academic life at the university etc. It acts as a bridge and assists the students in their transition from a school to the demands and requirements of a university.



REGULAR ACADEMIC SESSIONS

These were conducted as per requirement, fulfilling the primary aim of ASP, to help students gain an all-round understanding of complex legal concepts. STUDENT RESEARCH DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL (SRDC)

GNLU has been structured to be a research-based teaching university in clear recognition of the significant synergies between teaching and learning the existing literature on one hand. And on the other hand, research towards finding solutions and adding to existing literature. In order to encourage unique and interdisciplinary research that engages with relevant contemporary issues, it has geared its research-based teaching to remain open to new developments. The Student Research Development Council (SRDC) brings this understanding to the students, so that they can engage themselves proactively and creatively towards finding answers to those issues.

CREATION OF STUDENT RESEARCH INTEREST GROUPS:

Under SRDC—Student Research Interest Groups (SRIG), free-entry and free-exit student bodies with Students members Coordinator and Co-Coordinator form teams for different subjects and functions. Groups and sub-groups are created which are categorized and classified across different subjects. A total of 308 students are members of SRIG which includes 28 members as coordinator and co-coordinators. The SRIGs consist of 64 subjects which are clubbed into 15 major subjectgroups.

CENTRES OF EXCELLENCE

VS Mani Centre for Air and Space Law (VSMCASL)

Technological advancement has made International civil aviation a necessity in our contemporary world and reduced the globe into a village by bringing people closer. It has emerged as a classical example of global cooperation both on the ground and in the airspace. Its safety and security is of paramount concern in the light of the adoption of newer ways to threaten aviation infrastructure. At the same time, commercial considerations are its fundamental drivers and well-developed civil aviation industry is vital to any modern economy. International regulatory framework for Air Law strives to achieve an optimal balance between these competing considerations. India, being the world's largest and most diverse democracy is no exception. With ever increasing human activities in space, complex issues pertaining to its safety, security, environment etc. seeks redressal through international space law which regard space as 'Province of Mankind'. Further, private players too have entered the fray and are gradually becoming indispensable partners in the space industry. At the domestic level, nations have come up with policy and enactments to facilitate as well as regulate them. India too is one such nation. VSMCASL was established in 2019 to engage, in various ways, in shaping the emerging discourse in the field of Air and Space Law.

ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN

5th Edition of GNLU Air and Space Law Academy (GASLA), 27 September to 4 October, 2020.

The Academy was organised by the Centre in collaboration with the Institute of Air Law, Space Law and Cyber Law, University of Cologne, Germany. Spanned over eight days, eminent experts in the field of air and space law from India and overseas covered various topics such as protection of aerial sovereignty, military air law, aerial terrorism, regulation of unmanned aviation systems (drones), environment protection of space (space debris), regulating the surge in small satellites, space tourism, space insurance, contemporary issues of the Indian aviation industry, regulatory challenges in developments of airports in India and need for national space legislation for India.

GNLU Centre for Intellectual Property Rights (GCIPR)

The webinar was organized as a part of the International Association of Law Schools (IALS)



ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN

Mental Health Awareness Programme, 18 February, 2020

The half-day event hosted Dr Nisha Khanna, a Mental Health Professional, Renowned Psychologist and Certified EQ coach who addressed the gathering and had a fruitful discussion on issues relating to mental health that the youth in India is undergoing.

Workshop on Learning Disability, 19 February, 2020

The workshop aimed to sensitize the participants about different aspects of learning disabilities and to train the participants on creating an inclusive environment for the students with learning disabilities. Webinar on Rights of Women with Disabilities in India, 30 June, 2020

The webinar provided detailed information about the rights of women with disabilities and the current government policies and other aspects. Around 100 academicians, research scholars, students and disability activists from across the country participated in the webinar. Ms Shampa Sengupta, Dr Shipli Bhattacharya, Mr V. Murlidharan and Ms Meenakshi B. Equals were the expert resource persons.

Virtual Summer School on Disability Studies, 8 to 16 August, 2020

The Centre organized nine-day virtual Summer School on Disability Studies with an aim at providing the participants with different dimensions of disability. More particularly, it focused on the legal aspects of Disability Studies. One unique feature of this virtual summer school was that participants included students with impaired hearing. For their benefit, organizers had arranged two sign-language interpreters.

Webinar on National Education Policy 2020 on Disabilities: Expectations, Assurances and Realities

The Centre in collaboration with Sruti Disability Rights Centre organized a webinar on 'National Education Policy 2020 on Disabilities: Expectations, Assurances and Realities' to celebrate the International Day of People with Disabilities 2020.

Comments on Draft Bills and Amendments

During the semester, GCDS has submitted recommendations/comments on various draft bills and proposed amendments to the concerned ministries of the Government of India.

Draft University of Disability Studies and Rehabilitation Sciences Bill, 2021

Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India proposes to establish a special university on disability studies and had invited comments from various stakeholders on the Draft University of Disability Studies and Rehabilitation Sciences Bill, 2021. GNLU Centre for Disability Studies analysed the draft bill and submitted its comments and suggestions to the Ministry to ensure that the objectives of the act are met fully.

Proposed amendments to the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992

The government proposes to make certain amendments to the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992 and has invited comments on the proposed amendments. After studying the proposed amendments, GNLU Centre for Disability Studies has submitted various recommendations to the Ministry. The main recommendations are: the objective of the act should not be diluted, financial support from the Central Government should continue and the autonomous legal status of Rehabilitation Council of India should be retained. Many disability organisations like the National Platform for the Rights of the Disabled (NPRD) have also expressed similar concerns.

Better Implementation of National Education Policy 2020 towards Persons with Disabilities

Government of India have invited suggestions on implementation of NEP 2020. In this connection, GNLU Centre for Disability Studies obtained views of various disability rights activists through a webinar in collaboration with Sruti Disability Rights Centre. Based on the same, GCDS has submitted its recommendation to the Government of India. The main recommendations include better inter-ministerial coordination and provision for nursery and primary education of children with disability.

Decriminalisation of Minor Offences under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016

The Government of India proposes to remove certain penal provisions contained in Section 89, 92 and 93 of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and has sought comments on this proposal. After a careful study of the proposal, GCDS made a recommendation to the Government that these provisions are the enforcing provisions of the Act and should, therefore, not be removed.

GNLU Centre for Constitutional and Administrative Law (GCCAL)

CCAL strives at achieving the goal of nullifying the gap between theoretical and practical aspects regarding the functioning of various constitutional and administrative bodies in order to provide a flourishing environment for the growth of future administrators, legislators, interpreters, decision-makers, academicians and responsible citizens of this country.

THE GNLU CENTRE FOR LAW AND ECONOMICS

Law and Economics is a niche area dealing with the interface of the two subjects, wherein economic tools are used to better understand the law and to find its efficiency and working. The field Law and Economics or Economic Analysis of Law is concerned with this interface between the subjects of law and economics. It permits the greater use of economics to examine the law in addition to recognizing the importance of law to an analysis of the economy. Today, the field of Law and Economics has expanded into more areas such as property, contracts, torts, criminal law and procedure, constitutional law, administrative law, environmental law, family law, etc. The inherent advantage of this field is that its objective nature permits the legal system to function rationally and more efficiently. Besides, it provides a useful normative standard for evaluating law and policy. However, despite these significant advantages, Law and Economics has not gained much recognition in India, as compared to developed countries.

Academy on Law and Economics, 25 to 30 August, 2020



GCLE received 60 entries from undergraduate and postgraduate students across India. GNLU student Krishna Agarwal bagged the first prize of Rs.15,000 for his essay on "Reshaping and re-structuring the Judiciary: Law and Economics Analysis." GNLU student Pranay Jalan got the second prize of Rs.10,000 for his essay on "The Incidence of Safety Regulation on COVID-19 Compensation Claims." The third prize of Rs.5,000 went to Varada Shyama Bhat N & Mahek Khandelwal of School of Law, Christ University for their essay on "An Institutional economic analysis of wearing a mask." The top five Essays will be published in GNLU Journal on Law and Economics: COVID-19 Special Issue.



THE GNLU CENTRE FOR LAW AND SOCIETY (GCLS)

GCLS carries its tasks through two wings i.e., the Law & Society Wing and the Legal Services Committee. The Law and Society wing is a reconstitution of the erstwhile GNLU Centre for Law and Society. It functions as a socio-legal focal point for research. facilitating interdisciplinary multidisciplinary research and study on law and society, and law and legal institutions. The objective is to make the findings easily accessible to professionals in government, business, or the law, and in so doing, to bridge the gap between academia and policymaking.

The ranks have been curated based on more than 70 individual metrics. The release function was graced by Retired Chief Justice of the Bombay High Court, Justice (Rtd.) Mohit Shantilal Shah, Chief Editor of the India Justice Report Ms Maja Daruwala, Head of Policy and Advocacy at the Tata Trusts Ms Shireen Vakil, Co-founder and Vice-Chairman, Centre for Social Justice Mr Gagan Sethi and GNLU Director Dr Shanthakumar.



Open House on State of Constitutionalism in India, 13 January, 2020

The Saral Kanoon project of the foundation aims to make complex laws more accessible to society at large. GCLS has embarked on a project to prepare handbooks which would consolidate laws in a simplified format, with the intent of making them more accessible to various stakeholders. Three such handbooks on Women Rights, Children's Rights and Prisoners' Rights have been prepared and they will be published shortly.

5 th GNLU Essay Competition on Law & Society, 2020

The theme of the Essay Competition was "Issues and Challenges during and post the Global Pandemic: Possible Reforms, Strategies and Solutions". The competition was open to students from the law as well as non-law disciplines. The competition has received an enthusiastic response with 243 entries on a wide range of issues such as Economics in the time of a global pandemic, Justice in the time of COVID-19, Decoding the legal framework for pandemic control, Mental Health and Wellness, The validity of the use of force against violators of lockdown, Impact and role of mass media during the pandemic, Effectiveness of public health communication to create psychological resources for developing resilience, Reduction of stigma, prejudice, discrimination, and inequalities, Privacy v. 5 th GNLU Essay Competition on Law & Society, 2020

The second volume of Law and Society Review (LSR) was released in July 2020 as a special issue on the theme "Algorithms, Law and Democracy" with Dr Naveen Thayyil, Associate Professor of Law and STS at IIT-Delhi, as the Guest Editor. The special issue comprises articles written by a host of scholars and students from around the world on this emerging but not adequately studied domain, especially in India.

The LSR is an annually published, faculty-cum-student led, double-blind peer-reviewed academic law review focusing on socio-legal issues and processes. It employs and encourages an interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary approach to the study of law and legal issues. LSR aims to further the cause of open-access publishing which is of late gaining traction in academic publishing.






STUDENT STRENGTH

SPECIALIZATION-WISE STRENGTH LLM BATCH (2019-2020)







GRADE WISE RESULT OF UG BATCH (2019-2020)

THE TENTH CONVOCATION

The tenth convocation of Gujarat National Law University was held on February 15, 2020. Dr Justice D. Y. Chandrachud, Hon'ble Judge, Supreme Court of India and Visitor, GNLU delivered the Convocation Address.

Thirdly, to strengthen their knowledge, skills and attitudes in such subjects, where quantitative and qualitative techniques and laboratory activities are involved, so that, the necessary guidance and training provided under the programme may enable the students to come up to the level necessary for pursuing higher studies efficiently and to reduce their failure and dropout rate. Prepare students to gain useful knowledge for employment in Group A, B and C in Central services, State services and equivalent positions in the private sector.

GENDER SENSITIZATION COMMITTEE

The philosophy of Gender Sensitization at GNLU involves creation of value and virtue-based systems for gender equality. It involves creation of a gender sensitive social and cultural environment which discourages gender biased behaviors and practices.

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE

TThe University aims to provide a safe working and learning campus life for staff and students, free from gender discrimination and sexual harassment. As per the guidelines given by the UGC's Saksham Report with respect to the constitution of Complaints Committee on "Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace", GNLU has constituted the Internal Complaint Committee (ICC). The ICC shall be responsible for the formal redressal of complaints of gender discrimination and sexual harassment. It shall receive the complaints, conduct inquiries and recommend disciplinary action, if any, in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations. GNLU is committed in terms of providing a working environment as creative, productive and fulfilling. This includes ensuring that each student, teacher and non-teaching staff work together, in an environment of mutual trust, freedom of expression and dignity, free from all forms of violence, harassment, exploitation, discrimination and intimidation. Accordingly, ICC has framed the rules and regulations namely, 'Sexual Harassment of Women at the GNLU, Redressal of Complaints Regulations 2014', after due deliberations and same has been notified by the University. These regulations prescribe the institutional process to handle complaints of reported Sexual Harassment issues. Gender Sensitisation Committee is also responsible to create awareness on gender related issues and promote gender sensitisation.

GNLU COMPETITIVE EXAM GUIDANCE COMMITTEE (GCGC)

The Gujarat National Law University has taken up the responsibility of grooming and spearheading awareness for Civil Services, Judicial Services and other competitive exams under the aegis of the GNLU Competitive Exam Guidance Committee (GCGC). The GCGC has been functioning since 2010. The primary objective of the committee is to groom students in their preparations for the UPSC and the Judiciary examinations. The Committee is coordinating with several professional institutes that have experience in training and grooming aspirants into officers.

CRITIQUE - A STUDENT DISCUSSION FORUM

Critique is a student discussion forum that eliminates hierarchy and initiates such conversations about the most pressing issues that our society faces with the humble aim that discussants may leave the platform with an understanding about a new perspective. The kind of perspective, specifically, that can neither be gained from books nor from lectures. Where the forum does not press strongly regarding the achievement of goals, it places much greater emphasis on method. The forum ensures that it remains open to all views expressed by students and this openness is designed to strike at the root of various prejudices, misconceptions and stereotypes that often remain embedded in our minds.



DEBATING SOCIETY

The GNLU Debating Society was formed with the aim to promote parliamentary debating within University and to increase participation in national and international debating competitions. The Society considered it necessary to inculcate debating as an everyday activity among GNLU students and, hence, introduced the concept of the GNLU Debating League (GDL) which meant holding weekly debating sessions and maintaining a tab of participation. The Society's aim was to make debating a culture within GNLU, and to develop that idea, it was necessary to have an international debating competition within the University.







GNLU DIGITAL MEDIA

GNLU Digital Media (GDM) is constituted to cover all the activities of the University in coordination with other Committees. The GNLU Digital Media Committee provides a common platform for all events whether Cultural, Academic, Sports or Entertainment. For the purpose of swift and efficient management, the GDM Committee is composed into three sub committees, namely the Operations Wing, Research and Content Creation Wing and the Multimedia Wing. We strive towards exploring and portraying opinions, views and coverage of social and legal issues, alumni interactions and faculty interviews. The Team has an inside track, which provides substantive content, thoughtful commentary, and informed discussion with an occasional bit of wit and irreverence.



GNLU LEGAL INCUBATION COUNCIL

GNLU Legal Incubation Council (GLIC) is established as part of GNLU's vision towards excellence in imparting quality legal education and executing the same in the form of support system for entrepreneurs in the domain of law and interdisciplinary domains through institutional mechanism. GLIC intends to act as a tool to promote innovation, entrepreneurship and self-employment amongst law students as an attractive and viable career option.

The Council established in the year 2016 to convert students' enterprising ideas to be converted into full fledge startups through institutional support mechanism by providing faculty and industry mentoring, funding and networking opportunities. In 2018, the incubation centre of GNLU registered itself as a GNLU Legal Incubation Council Section 8 company to provide its services in more formal and professional manner.

In the year 2017, under the State Government's scheme of Student Startup and Innovation Policy, the GNLU received the grant of Rs. 20 lakh to promote innovation and entrepreneurship. This grant helped the incubation council to promote entrepreneurship activities on fast-track mode by organizing various activities like Annual Business plan competition, expert lectures, workshops, seminars including providing seed funding to student run startups. Since inception, the incubation center has supported total 19 student run start-ups.

OBJECTIVE

- The main objective of establishing the GNLU Legal Incubation Council (GLIC) is to act as an institutional mechanism for providing various startups related services in all aspects of building enterprise to develop the startup ecosystem in the country.

- To promote knowledge-driven and technology-based ventures among the students, faculty, and alumni, equip them with necessary entrepreneurial skills, and provide all the required assistance.

LEGAL HISTORY MUSEUM

With an aim to bridge the gap between law and society, GNLU established a Legal History Museum in 2014. The Museum is committed to preserve the Legal Heritage of the world and bring awareness about it in the society. The museum also aims to inspire the younger generation of the country to contribute in the development of the legal sector of India. The museum so far has 394 objects in its collection. It has so far developed 5 galleries; the main collection of the museum includes the copy of Sardar Patel's 1912 Law Degree, replica of Magna Carta 1215, Cyrus Cylinder 6th Century BC and copy of the Indian Constitution in Hindi and English. The museum also includes the exhibit of the Diorama of the Great Trial of Mahatma Gandhi 1922 made of Fiber plastic. This is the new exhibit of the museum. It induces the life size sculptures Mahatma Gandhi as well as of the people that witnessed the Great Trial of Mahatma Gandhi in 1922.

- The Glorious Gujarat and Legacy of Law Gallery



INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY

The University has a state-of-the-art ICT infrastructure on the campus. Computer Systems of all offices and workplace of the University are connected through LAN with high-end Servers. The Computer Networks of various buildings are interconnected through fiber optic cables. The University has I Gbps connectivity on optical fiber under NMEICT/NKN project for Internet access. The WiFi Network connectivity is available at the Hostels, Admin/Library block, Mess, Faculty cabins, Guest house and some outdoor locations of the campus. More than 230 computer systems with latest configuration and updated genuine software are installed at various sections and divisions of the University. The ICT Section manages the Campus Local Area Network of GNLU and provides technical support for Computer Hardware, Software and Network Infrastructure to the users. The Section is responsible for the availability of intra-campus connectivity of all the departments, hostels, staff quarters, guesthouse and the internet connectivity in the GNLU Campus.

LANGUAGE LABORATORY

The University offers seven foreign languages courses to the students. These include French, Spanish, Japanese, Chinese, Arabic, Swahili and German. It is compulsory for the first semester students to learn a foreign language. The students may choose to learn any one of the seven languages offered. GNLU conducts foreign language classes every semester and shall run parallel to the regular semester. Each language is taught for a minimum of 120 hours, stretching across three semesters. This gives them basic proficiency in reading, listening, speaking and writing in the language of their choice. A final test is conducted in each foreign language a week before the regular end term examination. On successful completion, students are provided with certificates on the basis of their grades.

State-of-the-Art Language Laboratory: GNLU is proud to have established a state-of-the-art language laboratory. It is used optimally by foreign language faculty for speaking and listening modules. The University also plans to use the language laboratory as a repository of Ancient Indian Languages. In the years to come, the University hopes to offer the study of ancient Indian languages such as Pali, Ardhmagadhi, Sanskrit, etc.



LEGAL SERVICES COMMITTEE

The Legal Services Committee set up under Section 4(k) of the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987, rides on the principles of empowering the society with legal awareness and legal aid. Over the years, the LSC has strived to recognize the potential of law as an instrument of social change. The Legal Services Committee acts as a 'community legal clinic' and focuses on, inter alia, the deprivation of government benefits, eviction and issues of domestic violence. The LSC has always been motivated to work for the betterment of the society and more so for the enhancement of living standards of the underprivileged. In this regard, activities such street plays, drama performances and community legal service programs which promote legal awareness in areas akin to environment, consumer rights, human rights, right to information and labour laws are often organized by the LSC.

GNLU PRO BONO MANDATE

With a view to encourage students to give back to the society and to promote access to justice, GNLU from the academic year 2015-16, made it mandatory for each student to undertake Pro Bono activities for a minimum of 100 hours in his/her entire tenure of undergraduate law programme. Activities by GNLU students to complete their mandate includes undertaking legal literacy programmes, conducting social awareness programmes, promoting government schemes, providing legal advice, assisting Legal Services Authority, undertaking cleanliness drives among others. This Pro Bono mandate of the students is overseen by the Pro Bono wing, which is a part of the Legal Services Committee. As per the Pro Bono guidelines, a student can undertake Pro Bono work only under a gazetted officer. The students are required to complete at least 20 hours of Pro Bono work each academic year, thereby culminating into 100 hours of Pro Bono work in five years of their undergraduate law programme. On completion of their Pro Bono work, students are required to submit a certificate signed and stamped by the gazetted officer under whom the Pro Bono work was undertaken and a report explaining the nature of work and the impact of such work in the community.

These certificates and work completion reports are then scrutinized by the faculty convenor of the Legal Services Committee. Non-completion of the Pro Bono mandate leads to punitive measures such as withholding examination results and removal from membership of all centres, committees and clubs run by GNLU. The Pro Bono wing also undertakes certain activities throughout the academic year where students are awarded Pro Bono hours for volunteering. Some of the activities undertaken by the Pro Bono wing include undertaking door-to-door awareness campaigns on domestic violence act, procedure to file FIRs; street plays; Swacch Bharat campaign; organising blood donation drive among others. In order to motivate students to contribute to the society, GNLU has also introduced the Annual Pro Bono Legal Aid Award. One student from each batch is felicitated with this award for the Pro Bono work undertaken by her in an academic year. A special panel is set up each year to evaluate the work undertaken by the nominees and the panel looks into indicators such as nature of the activity, sociolegal impact of the activity among others.

PRO BONO Activities

LSC, as a part of its mandate, undertakes a lot of Pro Bono work including both providing legal aid and creating legal awareness. These activities are in addition to the Pro Bono work undertaken by GNLU students as a part of their academic requirement. Some of the activities undertaken by LSC have been described in brief as follows: Running a Legal Aid Clinic Operating Legal Aid Clinic at the University has always been one of the major activities being performed by LSC. The office timings of the clinic are 3 pm to 5 pm on a daily basis and on weekends we extended the office timings for additional 2 hours, i.e., from 10 am to 12 pm. For each session a group of 3 to 4 students are sent to the clinic and they are required to note down necessary details which includes personal details of the villagers, factual aspects of his legal issue, the genesis of his grievances and other necessary things as deemed fit. Further, another team of students comes up with a preliminary research on the issue to help us decide the legal position of the aggrieved person in the matter. Further, if required the committee also seeks assistance of pro bono lawyers which are in collaboration with LSC.

Know Your Rights Initiative

Know Your Rights' initiative is a flagship legal awareness program conducted by LSC targeting school students. The session is usually conducted in four parts designed to cover different topics of discussion. In the first part the students are familiarized with the concept of law and rules, this is often discussed by bringing in analogy from different sports that the students play.

In the second part, students are given an introduction to the Constitution of India, ideas enshrined in the Preamble, fundamental rights and fundamental duties. Instances which show how enjoyment of rights are accompanied by responsibilities are also discussed. In the third segment, there is a discussion on the theme of three organs of government and separation of powers. The discussion involves topics like election, stages of law making in the parliament, hierarchy of courts and justice system, functions, roles and duties of police, concept of FIR and chargesheet, functions and duties of local authorities among others. A mock trial court is also conducted to familiarize students with court room setting and courtroom functioning. The fourth and final segment concludes the session with a quiz on the whole session. The objective of this initiative is to create more aware, responsible and confident citizens. PIL on Solid Waste Management LSC has assisted Adv. Aaditya Bhatt, a practicing advocate in Gujarat High Court, in filing a PIL on solid waste management in Ahmedabad. The team has identified specific failures on part of the responsible stakeholders in the implementation of the Plastic Waste Management Rules and prayed for addressing such problem. The PIL has been listed by the High Court and is in the stage of hearing.

Handbook Series

With the objective of simplifying laws and dissemination of legal knowledge, LSC has continuously been working on making handbooks. In the past, LSC has prepared handbooks on labour laws and Good Samaritan laws. Three handbooks have been prepared this academic year:

- Complete Guide on Women's Right: The objective of this handbook is to give a
 brief overview of the various legal provisions for women in India. The handbook
 follows a life cycle approach starting from the foetal stage to issues of marriage,
 employment, sexual harassment and even inheritance. Various laws applicable to
 women and their rights under such laws along with the procedure to avail them are
 succinctly explained.
- 2. Complete Guide on Children's Right: The objective of this handbook is to give a brief overview of the various legal provisions for children in India. Various laws applicable to children and their rights under such laws along with the procedure to avail them are succinctly explained.
- 3. Complete Guide on Prisoner's Right: This handbook specifies various rights available to a prisoner at the time of detention, both at the undertrial stage and after being convicted. It also elucidates provisions for arrest, bail, parole and furlough. In addition to the above, it mentions when and how an inmate can approach Legal Services Authorities, State Human Rights Commission, High Court u/s 482 of CrPC and Women's Commission by women inmates.

- I The purpose of this play was to show that there is a need to carve out a balance between the rights that a constitutional regime invests in one and the duties which a constitutional society expects from one. While one always craves for the protection of one's rights but when it comes to fulfilling the duty, there is no action. This Hypocrisy ingrained in the mindset was being showcased through the satirical play.
- Play Commemorating Gandhi: The Abhivyakti team tied up with the GNLU Legal History museum to present Gandhi's Historical Sedition Trial and related it with his pious teachings of non-violence and brotherhood which are still relevant today.

NSS Week

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is a Central Sector Scheme of Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports. It provides opportunity to the student youth of Ilth & 12th Class of schools at +2 Board level and student youth of Technical Institution, Graduate & Post Graduate at colleges and University level of India to take part in various government led community service activities & programmes. The sole aim of the NSS is to provide hands-on experience to young students in delivering community service. In collaboration with NSS, LSC conducted NSS week from 29 August 2019 to 4 September 2019 in Koba village. Activities in the NSS week included celebrating National Sports Day, conducting a cleaning drive, conducting a plantation drive, organising an Ayurveda camp, skit performance and conducting a blood donation drive.

Teaching Initiative

LSC believes that education plays an important role in creating more aware citizens and as its commitment to assist the Government of India in fulfilling the Sustainable Development Goals on education, LSC has undertaken two teaching initiatives:

a. Teaching primary school students Members of LSC teach Mathematics, English and basic Social Science to primary school students of Sector 2 Government Primary School every day between 3-5 pm. The objective of this initiative is to supplement learning of these students in close collaboration with the staff of this school. With the objective of encouraging these students in undertaking higher education, LSC also organised a campus visit for these children.

b. Adult literacy initiative on interacting with various support staff in GNLU such as cleaning workers, janitors, cook, guards it came to the students' notice that there are many amongst GNLU's support staff in need of adult literacy programme. Amongst the interested workers, LSC students differentiated students based on the level of education and an adult literacy class is run every Saturday between 3-5 pm.

Collaboration with District Legal Services Authority (DLSA)

In the past, LSC has collaborated with DLSA, Gandhinagar, for their initiatives such as:
a) Assisting them in Lok Adalats; b) Creating awareness about plea bargaining amongst inmates of Sabarmati Central Jail; c) Setting up a North-East Access to Justice Cell, which is a special legal aid clinic set up for the people of North-East.







LIBRARY AND LEARNING RESOURCES

Library is the central focus of all academic, research, extension and training activities of the university. The main functions of our library are acquisitions, dissemination, and preservation of information resources. Library as the learning place offers a comfortable, encouraging, and inviting environment for reading, research, reference, and academic interactions. Library provides huge space to accommodate more than 300 users at a time, with the common, group, and individual silent reading space facilities. The library occupies 2760 square meters of space and is the largest airconditioned wing in the administrative building to stack and preserve print and digital resources. The library has a vast collection of over 39990 print resources, books, e-books, law reports, journals, e-journals, online databases, and reference collections. Library has developed E-Books collections of Cambridge, Oxford, Edward Elgar, Taylor & Francis, Brill, Hart publications, etc.

Library Acquisitions

Library acquired more than 974 Books, which include books on international laws, Financial and Investment laws, Intellectual Property Rights, Management, other special collections on Law and Economics, Entrepreneurship, Start-up, Literature, Political science, History, Management, and Commerce, etc. The best collections in law and interdisciplinary subjects are of top priority for our library collections and development.

Special Collection

Library has acquired special collections on international law, Air & Space Law, Sports Law, and Maritime Law. We have an Institutional repository of GNLU on DSpace.

MODEL UNITED NATIONS (MUN)

The GNLU Model United Nations Society was founded in March 2015, with an aim to promote and foster an MUN culture amongst students within the University and outside. It aims to provide a platform where learning is facilitated by allowing students to confront a range of issues that the world is facing today. The objective is to enable students to broaden their worldview, develop an appreciation of differing views, face the challenges of negotiations, see the benefits and rewards of cooperation and discover the human side of international relations and diplomacy. At GNLU, the society aims to prepare students not only for their future careers but for global citizenship as well. The MUN Society does this through conducting intra-rounds every semester, as well as organizing a national-level inter-college MUN conference.





MOOT COURT COMMITTEE (MCC)

The GNLU Moot Court Committee (MCC) responsible for facilitating administering moot courts and allied competitions such as client counselling, in order to prepare students before they represent the University at the national, and international levels. The primary function of the MCC is to ensure that the standards of mooting in the University are enhanced every year and that deserving students get the opportunity to represent the University at moot court competitions, winning laurels both for themselves and for the University. The Committee also expands in order to form the Organizing Committees for annually conducting the GNLU International Moot Court Competition ("GIMC") and the **GNLU** Moot on Securities and Investment Law ("GNLUMSIL"). **GIMC** and GNLUMSIL have acquired the reputation of being quality platforms for discourse on niche areas of law viz. International Trade Law and Securities and Investment law respectively. The Competitions have attracted teams of the highest merit from far and wide to exhibit their research and advocacy skills on pertinent and emerging issues in these areas of law.

INTRA ROUNDS OF GNLU

Owing to the COVID-19 pandemic, a Memorial Based Intra Round was conducted in September as a screening round for students from the 2nd - 5th year. The moot problem drafted by Ms. Gayathree Kalliyat and Mr. Sameer Bhat, alumni of GNLU, was based on aspects of constitutional law where a total of 71 teams participated.

The MCC recognizes the difficulty faced by first year students to compete with their seniors in the very first go. Therefore, a separate memorial intra round moot based on municipal law was organized for the 202 first year students exclusively. For this academic year, the problem was drafted by Mr. Yuvraj Rathore and Mr. Isa Hakim, who are alumni of GNLU with the problem based on principles of grant of temporary injunction, validity of pre-telecast gag orders, defamation and fair comment, press freedom and right to fair trial/presumption of innocence, and applicable laws regulating journalistic conduct and TV channels.

The MCC has been grateful to have continued support from GNLU alumni in conducting these intra rounds. Several alumni took time to evaluate memorials submitted by students, and provide their meaningful feedback to them.

MOOT COACHING FOR FIRST YEARS

As part of the course of Legal Methods, a subject which is taught in the first semester, students of the first year participate in the Intra Moot Court Rounds organized by the Moot Court Committee. Students of the penultimate year who have participated in various national and international moot court competitions conducted coaching classes to first year students virtually, between 26 November and 22 December 2020. Through the course of the classes, the moot coaches introduced first year students to the format of moot court competitions, explained various legal concepts involved, steps involved in drafting a moot memorial and also conducted a mock oral round.

Additionally, moot experience sharing sessions were held by several GNLU alumni, who were avid mooters and participated in various national and international moots throughout their time at the University, to share their learnings from mooting, what they wished they knew when they were mooting and key aspects that a first year student must know while participating in a moot. Through these sessions, first year students were given an opportunity to interact with alumni and benefit from learning about their experiences.

GNLU INTERNATIONAL MOOT COURT COMPETITION (GIMC, 2020)

The 12th edition of the GNLU International Moot Court Competition (GIMC) was organized at GNLU during Feb 12-16, 2020. Symbiosis Law School, won the competition with University of Southampton, United Kingdom as runners-up. GIMC revolves around contemporary and contentious issues in trade law. It aims to challenge the legal acumen and research skills of participants in the field of International Trade Law and provides a platform for students to bring about innovative and unique arguments in their submissions. Over more than a decade, GIMC has garnered the reputation of being one of the foremost moot court competitions in this niche area of law.

The Moot Problem for 13th edition involved the simulation of a World Trade Organisation Panel, and issues about the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) and General Agreement on Trade in Services (GATS).

12th Edition drew participation from 52 law schools including six teams from overseas law schools — one each from the United Kingdom, Australia, Kenya, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, and Nepal. The finalist panel consisted of Dr Werner Zdouc (Director, World Trade Organization (WTO) Appellate Body Secretariat), Dr James Nedumpara (Professor and Head, Centre for Trade and Investment Law, Indian Institute of Foreign Trade), Mr Shashank Kumar (Dispute Settlement Lawyer, WTO) Mr V. Lakshmikumaran (Managing Partner, Lakshmikumaran & Sridharan), Ms Anuradha R V (Partner, Clarus Law Associates).

To make this moot a success, GNLU has partnered with, Lakshmikumaran & Sridharan Attorneys, Orrick, Herrington & Sutcliffe LLP, World Trade Institute, Centre for Trade And Investment Law, Indian Institute of Foreign Trade, Centre For WTO Studies, Indian Institute of Foreign Trade, Lex Witness, Eastern Book Company, SCC Online, Lawctopus.










OFFICE OF THE DEAN - STUDENTS' WELFARE (ODSW)



- · Coordinated anti-ragging duties by faculty and staff at the Hostel premises.




