

GNLU, DSA collaborate for space law training

Ahmedabad: Gujarat National Law University (GNLU) entered a collaboration with the Defence Space Agency (DSA) through an MoU for training and consultancy.

DSA is a tri-service entity within the Indian Armed Forces responsible for managing space welfare operations and the nation's satellite intelligence assets.

The MoU was signed by Commodore Vikrant Hattangady from DSA and Prof S Shanthakumar from GNLU.

It outlined the creation of a Centre of Excellence in Space Law, training programmes for armed forces officers, and consultancy to the Defence Space Agency related to space law. Prof Shanthakumar, the GNLU director, said the collaboration will be groundbreaking in the emerging field of space law in the Indian context.

Space PSU NSIL set to get 3 more in-orbit satellites from IsroSpace PSU NewSpace India Limited (NSIL) is expected to receive three more operational satellites, GSAT-11, GSAT-19, and GSAT-29, from Isro in order to lease out transponders. Last year, NSIL acquired 10 in-orbit communication satellites from Isro. The transfer of the additional satellites will require government approval. NSIL's ownership of these assets will enable the company to carry out the leasing of transponders and provide financial autonomy. The transfer aligns with the Centres Space reforms and NSIL's role as a full-fledged satellite operator.105445716
